## Crazy Bridge Fund Raiser!

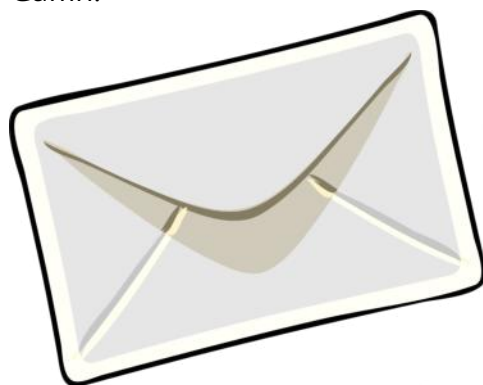

# Meeting Minutes

March 6, 2019

Meeting - 1:00 p.m.

President Cheryl Troxel called the meeting to order and welcomed members and a guest.

Dora Moffitt brought the invocation with a prayer for guidance.

President Troxel thanked the hostesses Nancy Priddy, chair, Peg Harding, Dora Moffitt, Ernestine Shugart, Janie Lewis, Cheryl Troxel.

Pat Flatt led the Pledges of Allegiance to the United States flag and the Texas flag.

Lisa Koiner introduced Teresa Sims who brought the program, "Celebrating Texas History in Hood County" for the TFWC-Texas Heritage Program. Teresa was born and raised in Granbury and is a founding member of the Texas Heroes Foundation Board. Granbury had not had a Texas Independence Day Celebration so the board worked to bring a celebration to Granbury that would educate the children and bring Texas history to life. For the first several years, the celebration was held on the courthouse square with vendors. The weather had not

been cooperative so the celebration was moved to the Acton Cemetery and adjacent areas. This year 7th grade Texas History students from all schools were brought to see the history fair which used the national history fair theme with a Texas twist, hear stories told by historical Texas characters, visit the Crocket Memorial, and learn about life in the early days of the Republic of Texas. Teresa Sims played Susanna Dickinson who with her infant daughter, Angelina, were among the few American survivors of 1836 Battle of the Alamo. Teresa then entertained the WWC members with her portrayal Susanna Dickinson's story.

Pat Flatt explained the connection of WWC to the descendants of Elizabeth Crockett. Using the 1984-85 WWC Directory, Pat shared with our guest speaker the names of WWC members and their relationship to our founding member, Mrs. A. W. Crockett. Many of these members were actively involved with WWC for over 15 years.

### Officer and Committee Reports:

Recording Secretary Ann Schmidt reported 39 active members, 1 honorary lifetime members and 1 guest for a total of 41 present. February minutes were filed as presented.

Treasurer Melinda Charbonnet presented the financial statement through February 28, 2019 (see attached).

Second Vice President Carolyn McLeod handed out an invitation and registration form for the 2019 GFWC Annual Convention in Austin this summer. She asked for members to register and help host the convention. Carolyn especially needs help with set-up and teardown of the room for the GFWC Texas Lone Star Night Welcome Banquet on Friday night, June 28, 2019. Please let her know if you can attend and help.

Corresponding Secretary Joyce Garrison read letters from the Rainbow Room and from Cindy Simmons announcing a contest for convention registration and meals fees for first time national convention attendees.
